One of the primitive graves of the...  
built the pyramid T 1, has been excavated...

Till now, we have found the location of five of these graves; on their levels were gathered two sandstone palette and one carnelian bead. These objects are of the same type as some objects

## Temple.

We enclosed the area occupied by the vestiges of the temple with a little wall (86 m. East-West x 58 m. North-South). This area has been also cleared of all the surface debris, which have been picked out.

We set down the position and levels of the fallen blocks the more visible, which amount to 223, in view of their study before their removal.

## West Tombs.

### Tomb.T 1

This tomb has been entirely excavated. We must only complete the study of its superstructure and the setting down of its plan. Its architectural study have been undertaken and we know now that the stairway was primitively covered with a ceiling in mud-bricks and round bits of wood. In the burial chamber, the rock-cut floor raise a little higher in the middle of the room, forming a sort of elevated rectangular platform on which were laying three schist slabs; it seems certain that this platform covered with big slabs has been used as pedestal for a sarcophagus.

We are now consolidating every fragment of the bones found in the chambers, in view of their study.

### Tomb T 3

The clearing of the pyramid has been continued. During this work, we found the complementary piece of the door-post fragment (T 3 s) decorated with a godhead in the figure of a monkey.

## Primitives graves in the gravel "kôm" T 1.

One of the primitive graves of the gravel "kôm", on which has been built the pyramid T 1, has been excavated. This grave (F 1) is an oval pit, whose bottom is at about 1 m. 30 below the surface of the "kôm". It contained a skeleton in hocker-position, on his right side with head in West. He was wearing on one of his arms the base of an elephant's tusk, as a high bracelet (which was unfortunately badly damaged). The grave contained also three wood(?) needles (one of them is fragmentary), decorated with incisions.

found in the "W kôm" of the neolithic sites of the Fayoum; ~~which~~ this make us believe that our primitive graves are neolithic.

Meroitic necropole.

The clearing of tomb I T 1 has been finished. The burial chamber had been completely plundered, as we <sup>had</sup> already understood; we found only the broken bones of a skeleton, accumulated in a corner of the chamber.

The rock-cut floor of this chamber formed, in the middle of the room, a sort of elevated rectangular platform (as in the chamber of the West Tomb T 1), on which we found the bones of the feet (still in situ) of the skeleton - the feet in East - and some plaster residues with traces of colours; these were certainly the vestiges of a painted stucco which ought to have wrapped up the mummy.

Several details of the architecture of this tomb indicate that the tomb in question is contemporary to the West Tomb T 1 of the 25<sup>th</sup> Dyn.. It seems so that the meroitic necropole include, in its Northern area (Sector I), some tombs of the 25th Dyn.
